

## TEP Interest Group Constitution

### **Mission and purpose:**

To represent the TEP creed: Friendship, Chivalry, and Service. Our Mission is to promote the reestablishment and expansion of the Chi Chapter of the Tau Epsilon Phi Fraternity on the University of Michigan Campus and Interfraternity Council.

### **Any affiliations such as local, state, national chapters, or businesses:**

This interest group adheres to the bylaws and code of conduct set forth by the Tau Epsilon Phi National Fraternal Organization.

### **Who is able to be a member of your organization:**

Any Male undergraduate student enrolled in the University of Michigan during the semester he chooses to join.

### **How a person becomes a member:**

When a person signs their name on the membership form, they become a member indefinitely, with the exception of a majority consensus removing him from the interest group.

### **Organization's leadership and how they are determined:**

There is no leadership structure. The only exception is the elected Signee, which as of now is Hunter Sonn, who will sign his name on any official documentation associated with the interest group. If Hunter Sonn should choose to abdicate from his position as Signee, any member may step forward and switch out the name of the Signee on the constitution for their own, effectively becoming the Signee.

### **How the organization would remove a member and individuals in an officer/leadership role:**

If a majority vote is reached to remove the existing Signee by existing members, then a new Signee may be elected by the largest vote, if multiple members should run. Otherwise, any existing member may volunteer for the role with majority consensus. Members may be removed by majority consensus if an existing member fails to adhere to the TEP creed.

### **Ratification of constitution:**

This constitution may be ratified at any time with majority consensus.
